Sexuality Education


Next week, students in Years 4-6 will commence a series of 3 sessions that will focus on Sexuality Education.

Mrs. Sheppard will be conducting these sessions, as she has done over the past few years.


Any parents wishing to learn more about the content or ask any questions is invited to attend a Parent Information session from 3.45 – 4.15 next Monday 31st May.
