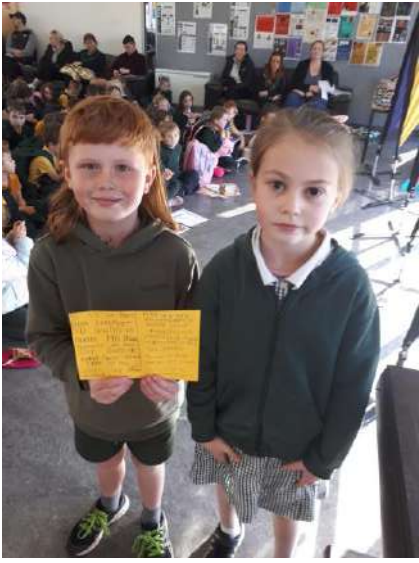
Melo Award

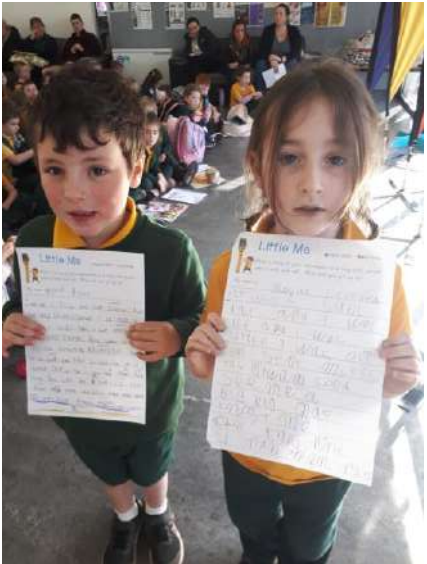
What's Going On in Maths
