STUDENT LEADER



LIONS CLUB



We pay our respects to the Anzac men and women who have fought for our country and have paved a better life for us all.




Our Foundation students

kitchen for TZS 2000 (1.26aud) a
day. Isaya has a disability which
makes it hard for him to walk long
distances. He recently had an
operation on his foot from which he
