Our student leaders also conducted a ceremony at school this week that highlighted the respect our students have for the men and women who gave service to allow us to enjoy the freedoms we have today.





TERM TWO OVERVIEW

We are certainly looking forward to what is going to be a very busy term of teaching and learning. Term two consists of nine weeks but contains three public holidays and two pupil free days. ADPS will undertake a School Review which occurs every four years and will be conducted over four days. NAPLAN occurs for Year Three and Year Five students in weeks 3 and 4 of this term. Key events for term two will be Earth Ed incursions, Divisional Athletics, junior and senior Cross - Country, Winter Sports (Years 5-6) and Brauer College Sports sessions. The final day for all students on-site will be Thursday 23^{rd} June with student interviews being conducted from 2.00-6.00 pm, with Friday 24^{th} June scheduled for student, parent and teacher interviews from 7.30-1.30 pm. A reminder to parents that our Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) will run a program from 7.00 am -6.00 pm on pupil free days and continues to offer before and after school care from Monday - Friday. We will endeavour to conduct our whole school assemblies in the Multi on a Friday. Parents are welcome to attend.

COVID UP-DATE

Face masks

Face masks, while recommended, are not required in any school setting. This means students in grades 3 to 6, staff and visitors in primary schools are no longer required to wear face masks. Any student or staff member who wishes to wear a mask may do so, including those who are medically atrisk.

Screening requirements

Students and staff who have tested positive for COVID-19, and have completed their 7day isolation period, now do not need to undertake rapid antigen test (RAT) screening for 12 weeks after their release from isolation. This was previously 8 weeks.

Household contacts

Students and staff who are household contacts of a COVID-19 case are no longer required to quarantine. They can return to school as long as they undertake rapid antigen tests (RAT) 5 times within their 7day period and wear face masks indoors if they are aged 8 and above unless they have a valid exemption.

Vaccination requirements for visitors to schools

Parents, carers and other adult visitors (not performing work) are no longer required to show evidence of two doses of COVID-19 vaccine


RAT screening program extension reminder
