## PRINCIPAL CHATTER

This week, students in Foundation, Year Three and Year Six have received a consent form to participate in the 'Lion's Club Eye Health Program.' It is an opt in program scheduled for Monday $27^{\text {th }}$ March. Screenings can help identify children who may require further eye review/testing. The individual screening takes just a few minutes to perform. There is no physical contact made with the child and no eye drops are administered. Individual reports will be distributed. If a vision problem is detected, this will be written on the child's result sheet, and parents will be encouraged to seek a further eye assessment with an eye health professional.


Our school Athletics Sports were changed to Wednesday 29th March due to a delay with the new running track being laid at Brauerander Park.
Students will do trials at school and at the Recreation Reserve in order to gain selection into the District Athletic Sports scheduled for Wednesday 27 th March. You will also notice that this is the same date as the above Lion's Eye Health Program.
