Wellbeing Words of Wisdom.

Hello everyone. There has been a lot going on in the school in the past few weeks. It was wonderful to see how the F to 2 students participated in their own cross- country and the wonderful support shown but the older students. Great job to all the F-2 students who completed and to the families and friends who were there to cheer them on.

The students also acknowledged and engaged in supporting the "Do it for Dolly Day." Australia and Allansford District Primary School came together to spread kindness and a united message that nobody should face bullying alone.

Your support helps fund Dolly's Dream's vital anti-bullying and support programs, empowering young people, and the adults around them to stand up to bullying and its devastating effects.

In this week's article I just want to mention a few things about BULLYING and how we can work together to fully understand what it is and what it is not. Sometimes students do get these mixed up, which is perfectly understandable.

"When a person or a group behaves in ways—on purpose and over and over—that make someone feet hurt, atraid or embarrassed." It is important to distinguish bullying from other unkind, mean, and harmful behaviour. Calling someone a name or pushing someone once, being rude or having an argument with someone is not necessarily bullying.

At school, in the yard, classroom while playing at home there will be many incidences of others being unkind to each other. This might happen as a once off or occasionally, but this is not always bullying, although it may seem like it to the students at the time.

The 4 most common types of Bullying are verbal, physical, relational, and cyberbullying. There can be aggressive bullying and passive bullying. Both types of bullying impact on others and makes them feel unhappy, scared, isolated and fearful of not having anyone to play with.

Well, what can we do?

- 1. Talk with your child about bullying type behaviours. What are they? How often do they happen?
- Educated them about bullying and being an active bystander if they see bulling happening to their children or others. This is often done at school but at home the message can be reinforced with your child/ren.
- Help your child/ren be positive role models and show them how to be supportive to others. Build your child self-confidence to be strong and supportive.
- Be aware of what your child/ren are doing online.

The more bookings that come from the Allansford school community the more funds raised with all monies going toward updating the school's digital devices.


