"I feel being a learner is an important value at ADPS so you can gain the knowledge you need to achieve your goals."

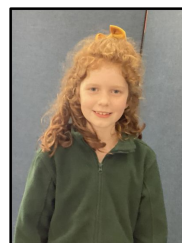
STUDENT AWARDS
