Dear Parents and families,

The Mental Health in Primary School has been a new initiative for the school in 2025. The school's Wellbeing profile has lifted with the increased support from the position and the current staff working in this space.

The program will run again in 2026, with a greater emphasis on individual and small group support with social and emotional learning. The MHiPS program aligns well with the Footstep Program which also will be in its second year in 2026.

The Wellbeing Team is currently investigating psychological support to the school, from an outside agency, around individual and group counselling services to our students and families. This may be offered either face to face or via telehealth.

If this is something that you might like to participate in next year, please contact me early in Term 1 next year. We will have more information around this opportunity by the beginning of 2026.

Thank you to everyone who has supported the program so far. Thank you to the Wellbeing SALT team who has helped myself and the Wellbeing Team run some student focused activities throughout the year. These students have shown great leadership skills and have been a positive asset to the school.
