
Showcase - The Weekend

Congratulations to students in F/1 who shared their writing about why we should plant trees. Emily, Pippa and Isla shared their reasons with the audience and read with great confidence.




Showcase - Edward the Emu

Drama Workshops

Students in Years 3-6 have completed a Well-Being Survey this term that has captured a snapshot of the mindsets of our students in relation to Work Confidence - Resilience - Organization -Getting Along – Persistence. This survey was given to the Year 3-6 students to determine baseline data. An average of all student results combined in the 5 key areas resulted in a score of 70/100. Trend data indicates that well-being for learning in the above dimensions decreases from Year 3 to Year 6. It is our intention to tackle that trend particularly in the areas of Work Confidence and Resilience. One strategy we are putting in place is a series of drama workshops that will commence on Friday 12th August and consist of 5 sessions. Students will be challenged to achieve their learning goal and targets using drama as a vehicle for learning. They will need to develops skills of voice and movement to create character, mood and atmosphere and focus dramatic action.
