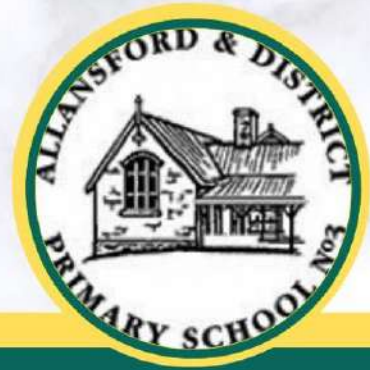
What is the Saputo-Allansford Recreation Reserve community farm?

The Saputo-Allansford Recreation Reserve Community farm is a voluntary group that grow out and sell Friesian steers, with all profits used for infrastructure upgrades at the Allansford Recreation Reserve.

The Allansford Recreation Reserve Committee of management is the only fully voluntary run group in Warrnambool shire who do all the upkeep and infrastructure upgrades on the recreation reserve. Our most recent example is the toilet upgrade in the social club rooms.

Funds generated by the community farm are not used by either the cricket or football/netball club, but strictly by recreation reserve committee of management for infrastructure improvements.

As you can see, the Allansford community benefit's twice from your generous donation!
