Congratulations Harper!



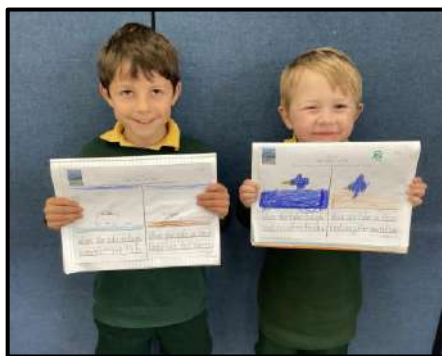
INTERVIEWS

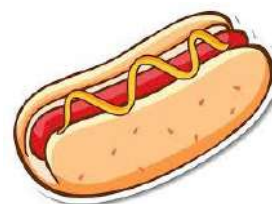

Japanese News



Foundation and Foundation/One students have been introduced to kanji characters as part of their learning this term. Recently, they have been exploring the concept of 'Tsuyu,' also known as The Rainy Season, which takes place during the month of June. Throughout this study, students have acquired proficiency in identifying the kanji symbol for rain 雨 and have perfected its pronunciation, 'ame.'



Last week we continued to explore Tsuyu, The Rainy Season, our students have been captivated by the story that reveals the precise timing of rainfall in different parts of Japan. In addition, they have discovered the enchanting tradition of Little Prayer Dolls, also known as Teru Teru Bozu, which children create to bring on sunny weather. These traditional dolls are usually hung in windows, both at school and at home, during the rainy season, with the hope of bringing forth clear skies and sunny days. Our Foundation and Foundation/One students have created their very own Teru Teru Bozu characters to take home and proudly display in their windows.



Whole School Buddies

During Whole School Buddies, students have been participating in activities focusing on Mindfulness, Kindness, and Pride. 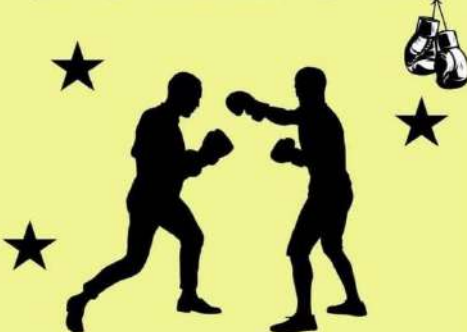
