LEARNING NEWS

Our model has four main parts that consist of: anticipate, launch, explore and summarize/review. Each component of the model requires skill and planning to effectively implement. Students are developing a strong understanding of what happens in each phase. There is growing evidence that the students are switching from a more passive approach which has relied on others to push, now choosing to be more active participants.

Got something broken you want fixed? Bring it along to one of our free Repair Cafe events. We can help repair, reuse and reuse household items such as bicycles, clothing, garden tools, toys, furniture, or you tell us.

REPAIR CAFE IS A WORLDWIDE MOVEMENT THAT ENCOURAGES PEOPLE TO REPAIR AND REUSE ITEMS RATHER THAN DISCARDING THEM. WARRNAMBOOL HAS EXTENDED THE LIFE SPAN OF PRODUCTS, REDUCED WASTE, AND LOWERED THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT OF CONSUMPTION.

Repair skills on offer:

- Clothing repairs: e.g. take up hem on dress, mend a hole
- Sewing: e.g. broken straps, shorts or skirts, missing link
- Mechanical: e.g. mower, sprinkler
- Electrical items: e.g. stereo, lamp, mix mixer
- Bikes: e.g. wobbly wheel, squeaking brakes, puncture
- Woodwork: e.g. household items or furniture that need fixing or gluing
- Other: if you can carry it in the door our repaiers are always up for a challenge!

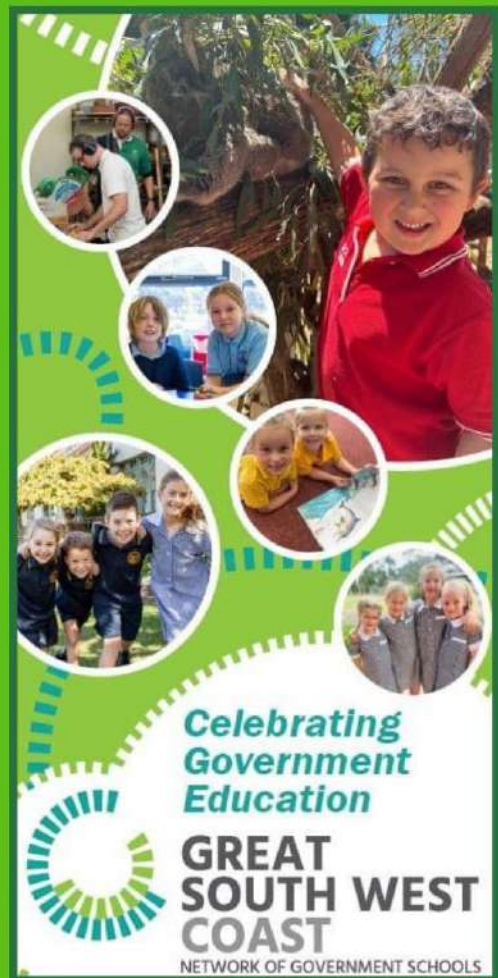
NOW MORE THAN EVER
