He started making raised garden beds using recycled items and donating them directly to individuals, respite house and aged care centres. He has recently donated to many respite houses in Hamilton as well as nursing homes in Warrnambool and two primary schools, using all new materials. From this, the business has grown to making and selling to everyone – with profits going to purchase materials to make more garden beds for donation. His main mission being to provide donations of raised garden beds to people with mobility issues – specifically wheelchair bound.

Craig donated the 450mm high garden bed to the Allansford & District Primary School, gaining huge satisfaction making the garden bed knowing how many little sets of hands would be in the soil and the benefits of this. It's an exciting and invigorating project providing garden beds to people who otherwise may not have the opportunity to garden.
