Our staff participated in a fantastic workshop last Friday facilitated by Behaviour Analyst, Dan Petro, Schools from across the network attended and were engaged in evidenced based practices in managing behaviours. Dan highlighted that a reasonable goal is to teach each student to be as independent and likeable as possible. He listed two valuable rules to follow: If what you are doing is working, don't change it and when making changes, do small things that give you big outcomes. He then provided many examples and scenarios on how teachers can positively impact a child's behaviour and learning outcomes.




Simultaneous Story-time

This week, students across the school participated in simultaneous story-time. All students attended the Multi and listened to the story, "The Family Tree.'






School Review

Congratulations to Timmy and Tulleah, who have qualified for Regions, to be held next week, at Deakin, Warrnambool.






