Many thanks to the parents for their attendance at this week's Year Two interviews. We have a high percentage of bookings which is very pleasing to see.




SOMERS CAMP

Parents' Club met this week to organise term 3 events and activities. Playground talks are progressing well, and we are all excited about the next steps. Parents' Club have donated \$500 towards some award-winning books that will be featured in Book Week activities later this term. LIONS CLUB EYE HEALTH

The Lions Eye Health Program is offering Free Vision Screening for students in Foundation, Year Three and Year Six. Over 80% of what children learn is processed through their eyes. Untreated eye conditions can affect a child's development. It is estimated 1 in 5 children in Australia have undetected vision problems. Screenings can help identify children who may require further eye review/testing. Members of the Lions Club have been specifically trained to perform four vision screening assessments including:

- 1. Visual Acuity using a Lea 3m 15 Line Symbol Chart
- 2. Colour Vision using a quick 6 Basic Colour Screening Book
- 3. Depth Perception using a Stereo Fly Screening Tool
- 4. Spot Vision Screener State of the art portable machine designed to screen for Myopia (near sightedness), Hyperopia (far sightedness), Astigmatism (blurred vision), Anisometropia (unequal refractive power), Strabismus (eye misalignment) and Anisocoria (unequal pupil size).

The individual screening takes just a few minutes to perform. There is no physical contact made with the child and no eye drops are administered. Individual reports will be distributed. If a vision problem is detected, this will be written on the child's result sheet, and you will be encouraged to seek a further eye assessment with an eye health professional.

If you would like your child to participate in this vision screening program, please complete the permission slip and return to the office.

Please note; if your child is already under the care of an optometrist, it is recommended they do not participate.

Ella participated in the Primary Performers production of "Annie Junior' during the holidays. Ella performed in four shows. She had a great time, and we are very proud of her efforts.




TEN-PIN BOWLING SUCCESS

COVID UP-DATE

Covid is still very prevalent within our school community, and we need to be vigilant and maintain Covid safe practices. The following are some key recommendations:

VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

There are no longer any mandatory vaccination requirements for staff or visitors working or attending mainstream schools.

RAPID ANTIGEN TESTS

The Victorian Government is providing up to three further deliveries of Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) in Term 3 and again in Term 4 to schools. These will be distributed for use by staff and students who are symptomatic or who are household contacts. Schools will receive the first delivery of Term 3 RATs by the end of week 3.

Household contacts are required to test negative using a rapid antigen test on at least 5 out of 7 if they are attending or working at a school onsite.

Parents must report a positive result to their school, either through the COVID Test <u>portal</u> or by phone or written notification; this is so the school can record that they will be absent while in 7-day isolation, provide support and learning materials as needed, and let the rest of the school community know there has been a positive case onsite and that they should monitor for symptoms

FACE MASKS

The <u>current advice</u> from the Victorian government is that it is recommended face masks are worn in indoor settings unless an exception applies.

WORKFORCE SUPPORTS

Schools will continue to experience workforce pressures through Term 3.
